## Understanding the Millage Rate & Voting Process

#### Current Millage Rate:

- 5.559
- Requires a 4/5 vote

#### 2% Millage Reduction:

- 5.448 (-\$2,595,389)
- Requires a 4/5 vote

#### 3% Majority Max Rate:

- 5.4199 (-\$3,247,154)
- Requires a 3/5 vote

#### Roll Back Rate:

- 5.1281 (-\$10,058,941)
- If no vote is reached before August 4, 2024

# How Much Will a 2% Reduction Save You?



#### Median Homesteaded Value:

- \$61.23 per year
- \$1.18 weekly

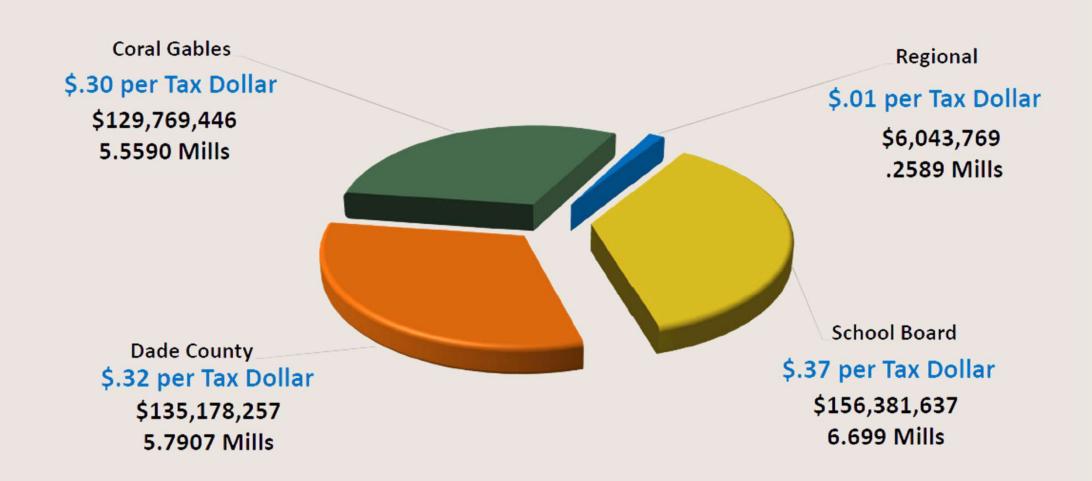
#### Average Homesteaded Value:

- \$105.00 per year
- \$2.02 weekly

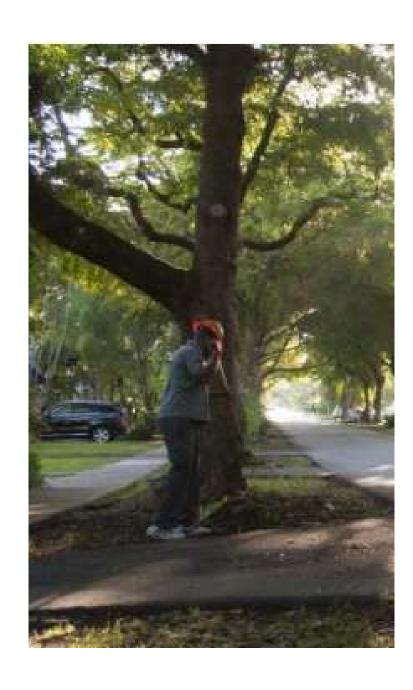

## AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAX DISTRIBUTION PER TAX DOLLAR



Property Tax Based on Estimated Taxable Values on July 1, 2024, of \$24,572,659,959 at 95% collection. Millage rates for the County, School Board and Regional are 2023 Adopted Rates.



## Impact on Public Works (Including Solid Waste & Greenspace)

Reduction to operating accounts: - \$166,841

Reduction for new needs: - \$238,057

Freeze positions: - \$304,086

Total reductions: - \$708,984

New needs not funded before the consideration of the 2% reduction: -\$1,435,208

## Solid Waste Garbage Back Door Service

The Solid Waste Department is currently experiencing a shortage of employees.

- Over the past two weeks, 12 employees have been out, leading to delayed routes.
- Summer Challenges:
  - Typically, 2-3 additional solid waste workers are employed during the summer.
  - However, usually 4-5 employees suffer from heat exhaustion, exacerbating staffing issues.

#### Trash Pits

• Understaffing leads to increased overtime for existing employees, affecting efficiency and morale.



## Solid Waste Garbage Fee Reductions

#### Public Works

To summarize the impact of the solid waste garbage fee reduction:

#### **Absorption Costs:**

- Current absorption: \$4 million
- Additional absorption due to new discount: \$3.9 million
- Total absorption: \$7.9 million

#### Solid Waste Garbage Fee Reduction Details:

- Early Payment Reduction
  - Reduction Amount: \$254
  - Equivalent median homesteaded millage reduction: 8.30% (or more)
- Regular Payment Reduction:
  - Reduction Amount: \$360
  - Equivalent median homesteaded millage reduction: 11.76% (or more)

# Impact on Innovation & Technology

Reduction to Operating accounts: -\$206,750

Freeze Positions: -\$85,771

Total Reduction: -\$292,521





## Impact on Development Services

Reduction to Operating accounts: -\$53,455

Reduction for New Needs: -\$149,458

Freeze Positions: -\$219,066

Total Reduction: -\$421,979

New needs not funded before the consideration

of the 2% reduction: -\$89,228

### The Reduction will affect:

#### Freezing the Developmental Director Position:

The position will remain vacant for an additional 6 months, on top of the 9 months it has already been vacant.

#### Freezing an Administrative Assistant Position:

This position supports delays and 65 employees, including the Director and Deputy. It recently became vacant.

#### Code Field Supervisor and Code Officer Positions: These positions will not be funded.

- Consensus was that Code needed more support and staffing.
- One Field Supervisor cannot cover both day and night shifts.



### Impact on Human Resources & Risk Management

Reduction to Operating accounts: -\$19,658

Freeze Positions: -\$82,255

Total Reduction: -\$101,913

### The Reduction will affect:

#### • HR Business Analyst Position:

- This position, responsible for auditing and full implementation for INFOR (including auditing of employee records, benefits, and pay), is being frozen.
- The HR Business Analyst is envisioned as the go-to person for these tasks.

#### • Trainings:

• Reduced funding will impact the availability and scope of employee training programs.

#### • ADA Fund:

• There will be no additional funds allocated to the ADA Fund, affecting compliance and accommodation initiatives.

## Impact on Police and Fire Services

New Needs Not Funded Before the consideration of the 2% reduction:

Police: -\$723,038

Fire: -82,182

#### Indirect Effects of Budget Cuts:

#### Operational Necessities:

- Police cars and fire trucks need to be running and well-maintained.
- IT infrastructure, including computers and communication systems, must remain functional.



## Impact on Police and Fire Services

#### Indirect Effects of Budget Cuts (continued):

#### Homelessness and Public Health:

- Sanitation and public works are essential for addressing homelessness.
- Code enforcement is necessary to maintain public safety and health standards.
- After-hours issues without code enforcement will require police intervention, diverting officers from other critical duties.

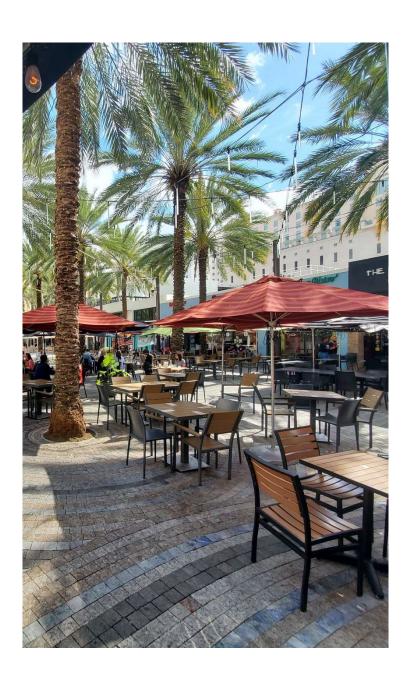
#### Service Delays:

• Reduced resources will slow the ability to resolve community issues efficiently.

#### Staffing Challenges:

- Currently, there are 38 police vacancies.
- Ongoing negotiations since March aim to address staffing and resource needs.





## Impact on Economic Development

Reduction to Operating accounts: -\$20,541

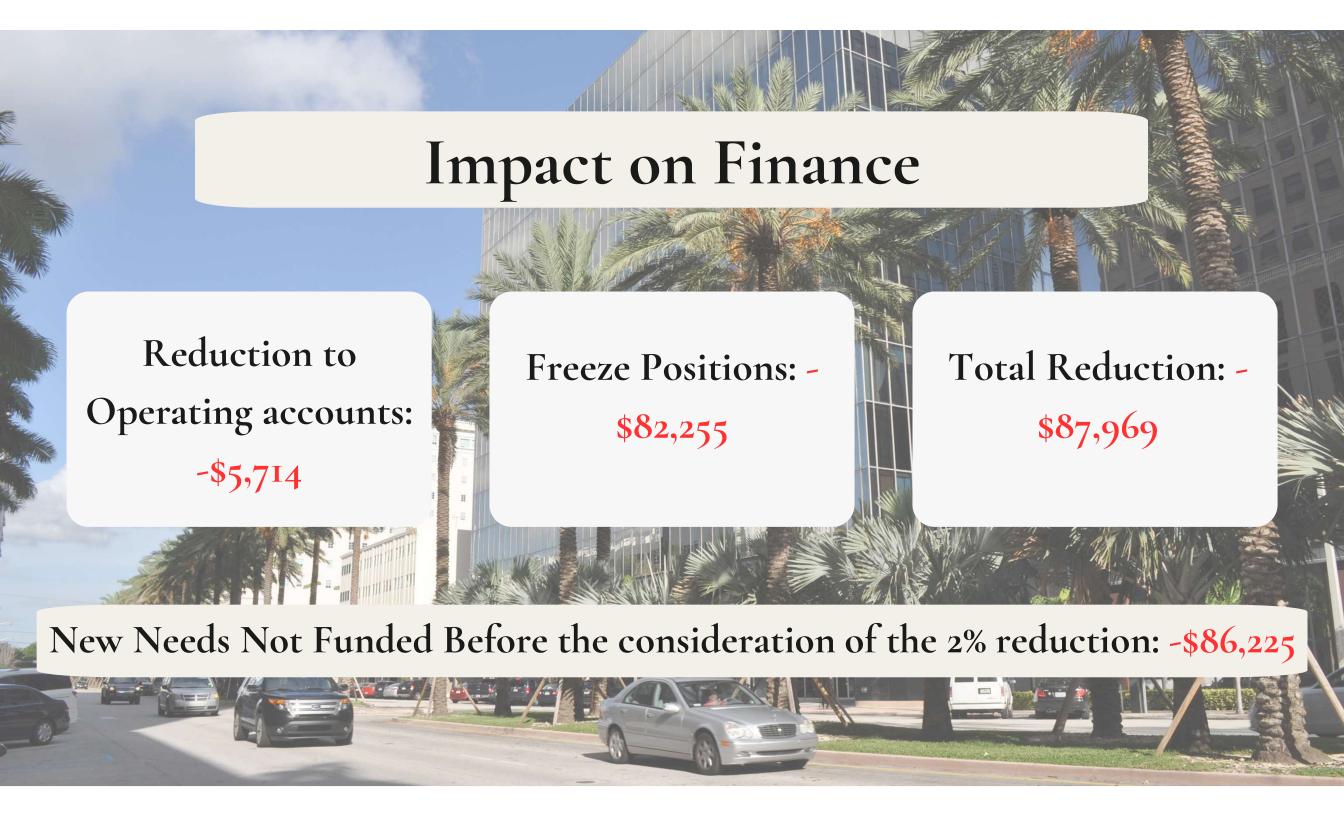
Reduction for New Needs: -\$300,000

Freeze Positions: -\$96,981

Total Reduction: -\$417,522

New needs not funded before the consideration

of the 2% reduction: -\$316,109



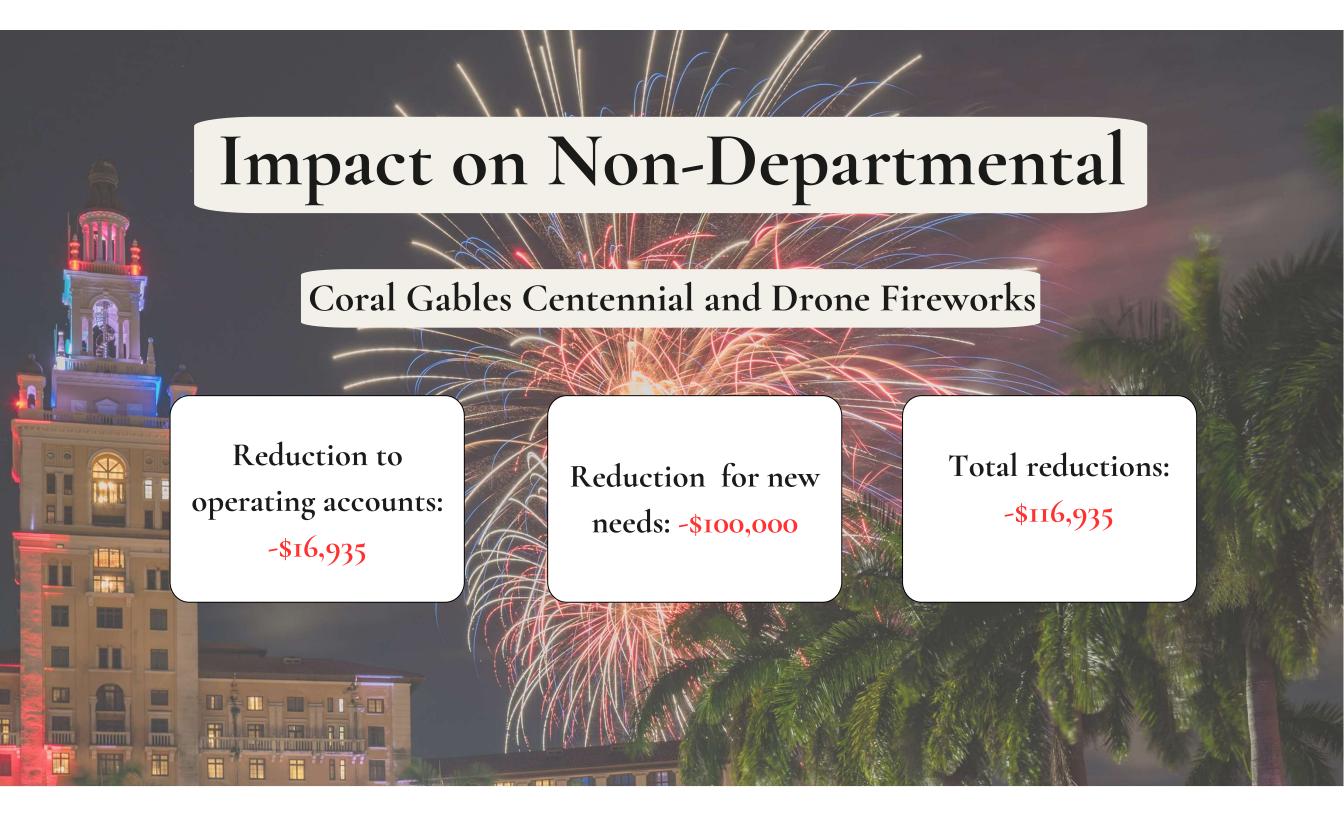


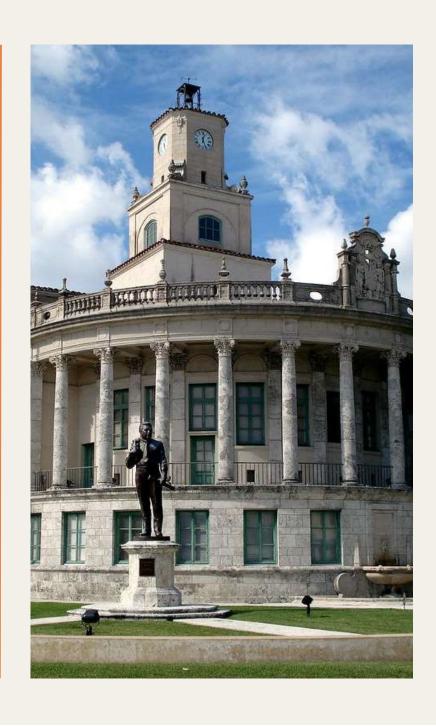
## Impact on City Clerk

Reduction to operating accounts: -\$3,272

Total Reduction: - \$3,272

\*Training 3 years to become a certified municipal Clerk





## Impact on City Manager

Reduction to operating accounts: -\$6,195

Total Reduction: - \$6,195

New needs not funded before the consideration of the 2% reduction: -\$48,621

#### This reduction will affect:

- Advertisement and promotions
- Mailings and communications to advise resident of what's happening

### Recommendations

#### Budget and Finance Department:

• Officially recommended **not** to lower the millage rate

#### Resolution (24-7731):

- The Coral Gables Budget and Audit Advisory Board recommended that the City of Coral Gables Commission maintain the millage rate of 5.559 mills for Fiscal Year 2024-25
- This resolution was adopted on July 9th, 2024
